Explain How the Pledging Works

Questions and Answers Concerning the Commitment Cards

There are four parts of the building process: (1) Developing the Master Site Plan, (2) Capital Fund Raising, (3) Securing Construction Drawings, and (4) Construction. The capital fund campaign comes before the construction documents so the church will know how much money it will have to work with. Thus, the pledge cards help the church to plan wisely.

When will I be asked to complete the card? After the August 11 banquet, visitors will

bring a commitment card and privacy envelope to your home. You are asked to complete the card while they are there and place it in the privacy envelope. You will not be asked to show the visitor the amount you pledge.

But what about pledging? People pledge all the time! Anyone who has taken a loan has pledged. Why pledge to the bank, but not God? Nehemiah 9:38-10:39 records a pledge similar to CTB.

Will anyone else know the amount of my pledge? No one except the financial secretary and those who help her total the pledges – and those you tell.

What if circumstances prevent me from fulfilling my pledge? First, the Lord knows how much you can afford and will lead you rightly. However, the commitment card says: "This statement of intention may be revised or cancelled should circumstances make it necessary."

But I Voted Against Relocation

What would it take?

What would it take each week to reach each of our three goals? Here's what the three-year goals look like averaged out on a weekly basis:

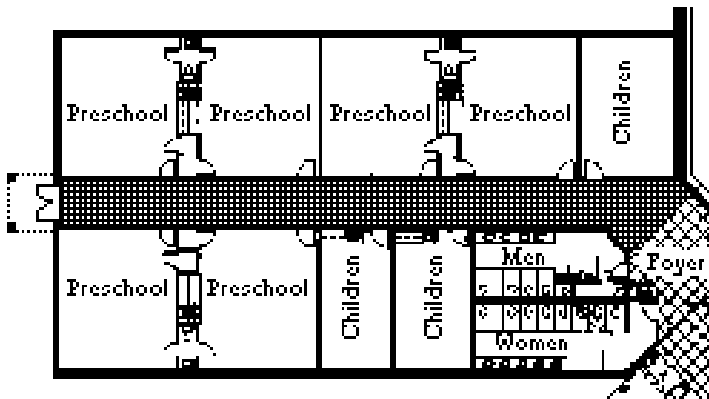
To reach our **VICTORY GOAL**: \$4,487 each week

To reach our **CHALLENGE GOAL**: \$8,974 weekly

To reach the **HALLELUJAH GOAL**: \$16,026 weekly

How much of this should you be giving? Of course it is perfectly acceptable to give on a monthly basis, or with a large kick-off offering, according to your needs. Just remember, that over 156 weeks your gifts can add up.

The **east wing** of the new building will provide quality space for children — 35 square feet per preschooler and 25 per child, grades 1-6. Every two preschool rooms share child-size restroom facilities. Also shown are the adult restrooms, conveniently located beside the foyer.
