TEAM

You can be on One (1) MINISTRY TEAM and One (1) SERVICE TEAM

You **cannot** be on two ministry teams or two service teams
If you are asked by Team Leaders to be on more than one ministry team or more than one service team, you have to choose between them.

If you want to know if the team you are being asked to serve on is a Ministry Team or a Service Team, READ the TEAM TASK DIRECTIVE given to you by your team leader. It says the name of the team and the kind of team on the top of the page. Examples: Evangelism *Ministry* Team and Sound Crew *Service* Team. Your term will begin JUNE 1.

The Team Task Directive is the job description of the team. It was approved by a vote in church conference. It tells your team what the church is asking you to do. Your team is free to decide how to carry out the task, but you Cannot change or redefine your team's task. So READ the Team Task Directive carefully before deciding whether to accept the invitation to join the team.

A TEAM is expected to be the church experts in their area of ministry or service. Team members are expected to TRAIN AND LEARN as much as they can about their area of ministry or service.

COMMITTEES PLAN WORK <u>OTHER</u> PEOPLE DO. TEAMS PLAN THEIR <u>OWN</u> MINISTRY — AND THEN <u>DO</u> IT.

Teams are the "administrators" for their ministry, as they involve others in the ministry, as needed. Hopefully, the evangelism team members aren't the only people in the church who witness. You don't have to be on the sound team to operate the sound system; the sound team can enlist non-members to help. But the team is responsible to organize and conduct their area of ministry or service.

Please **Pray** and ask God to lead you concerning accepting a position on this team. Then, let the team leader know of your decision in a timely manner.
